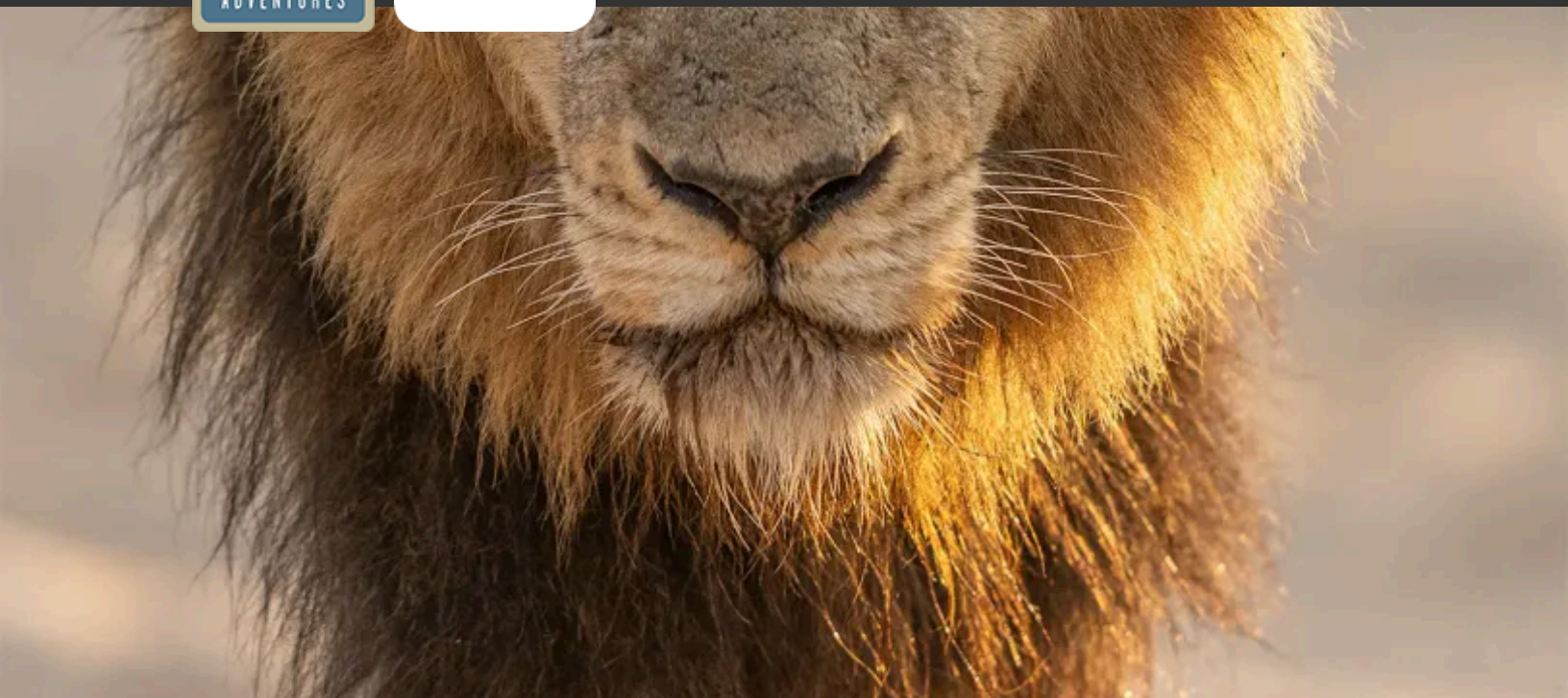

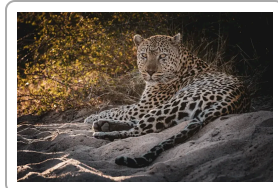

## 2026 Itinerary

### Day 1: Johannesburg, South Africa

Our South Africa Photo Expedition begins on arrival in Johannesburg. At our welcome dinner this evening, our Expedition Leader shares a preview of the many wildlife adventures and exciting photography opportunities that lie ahead on this exclusive safari itinerary.





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### Days 2 & 3: Madikwe Private Reserve

Transfer this morning to the Johannesburg airport for our flight to Madikwe Safari Lodge on the private Madikwe Reserve, tucked against South Africa's border with Botswana. Surrounded by grassland, forest and rocky hills, the lodge sits within a transitional zone where the lowveld of Kruger Park and the semi-arid Kalahari thornveld meet. At 185,000 acres, Madikwe is South Africa's fifth-largest private reserve. Supporting a broad range of wildlife, it is home to the Big Five as well as white rhino, cheetah, unique antelope species and the elusive African wild dog. Madikwe has the second-largest elephant population in South Africa, and leopard sightings are typically a highlight, too.

On exciting game drives, we go in search of outstanding wildlife photography opportunities in Madikwe's unspoiled wilderness, enjoying bush picnics along the way. After each exhilarating day, return to the comfort of our luxurious lodge, offering warm hospitality in this remote setting. Refresh in your private plunge pool, gather on the main deck to capture shots of wildlife that often ambles by, and enjoy fine dinners by the open fire in the boma. As the cloak of night descends, a spray of stars adds nature's glitter to the sky.

### Days 4 - 6: Marataba Private Reserve

A three-hour drive takes us from Madikwe to Marataba Private Reserve. Lying within Marakele National Park, this 57,000-acre mosaic of plains, mountains and valleys is home to predators, primates, antelope, small carnivores and more than 400 bird species. Marataba is a less-discovered treasure, and while it doesn't have the name cachet of Kruger or Sabi Sand, it delivers one of the most scenic and impressive photo safari experiences in South Africa. Black and white rhinos are a special focus here, and we seek them out in the company of our Expedition Leader and local guides adept at tracking them. Lion, leopard, elephant and buffalo round out the Big Five, with other abundant species on display, too, including greater kudu, eland, impala, giraffe, zebra, waterbuck, wildebeest, spotted hyena, bat-eared fox, jackal, chacma baboon and vervet monkey. Avian highlights include yellow-billed hornbill, African Scops owl, fiery-necked night jar and lilac-breasted roller. After dusk, we go in search of nocturnal animals to photograph. The camp's boat is also available for water safaris on the Matlabas River, where elephants snorkel and waterbirds abound.

In the evening, tuck into the comforts of Marataba Safari Lodge, which enjoys an unparalleled setting. Beautifully appointed stone and canvas tented suites are raised on stilts to survey the vast expanse of bushveld beyond. Views over the plains are spectacular, offering panoramic photos of the Waterberg escarpment merging into acacia savanna. Each luxury tent has a private shaded viewing deck, lending a sense of being one with the wild environment beyond.



### **Days 7 - 10: Sabi Sand—MalaMala Private Reserve**

Depart this morning on a private chartered flight directly to MalaMala Game Reserve, one of the oldest, largest and most highly regarded private wildlife sanctuaries in South Africa. Covering 33,000 acres and sharing a 12-mile unfenced border with world-renowned Kruger National Park, MalaMala lies in the heart of the legendary Sabi Sand region, the country's premier safari destination. Historic MalaMala was one of the first reserves to transition from hunting to wildlife-viewing safaris. Today it is renowned as one of the best places to photograph the Big Five in Africa. These famous five—lion, leopard, rhinoceros, elephant and Cape buffalo—were once favorite hunting targets, and while many were hunted nearly to extinction, reserves like this one have made inspiring strides in bringing them back.

Enjoy the exclusivity of MalaMala Main Camp, situated along the Sand River where wildlife regularly wanders in to drink, providing great opportunities for close-up photos. MalaMala is famous for its leopard viewing, and nighttime photography drives are a highlight here, with an array of nocturnal species on view, including predators on the hunt. ### Day 1: Johannesburg, South Africa

Our South Africa Photo Expedition begins on arrival in Johannesburg, where you are met and transferred to our hotel. At our welcome dinner this evening, our Expedition Leader shares a preview of the many wildlife adventures and exciting photography opportunities that lie ahead on this exclusive safari itinerary.





### **Days 2 & 3: Marataba Private Reserve**

Transfer to the Johannesburg airport for our flight to Thabazimbi, then continue by road to Marataba Private Reserve. Lying within Marakele National Park, this 57,000-acre mosaic of plains, mountains and valleys is home to predators, primates, antelope, small carnivores and more than 400 bird species.

Marataba is a less-discovered treasure, and while it doesn't have the name cachet of Kruger or Sabi Sand, it delivers one of the most scenic and impressive photo safari experiences in South Africa. Black and white rhinos are a special focus here, and we seek them out in the company of our Expedition Leader and local guides adept at tracking them. Lion, leopard, elephant and buffalo round out the Big Five, with other abundant species on display, too, including greater kudu, eland, impala, giraffe, zebra, waterbuck, wildebeest, spotted hyena, bat-eared fox, jackal, chacma baboon and vervet monkey. Avian highlights include yellow-billed hornbill, African Scops owl, fiery-necked night jar and lilac-breasted roller. After dusk, we go in search of nocturnal animals to photograph. The camp's boat is also available for water safaris on the Matlabas River, where elephants snorkel and waterbirds abound.

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### **Days 4 - 6: Phinda Private Game Reserve**

Take a chartered flight this morning from Thabazimbi to Phinda Private Game Reserve, one of South Africa's most ecologically diverse safari destinations. Spanning more than 70,000 acres, Phinda encompasses seven distinct habitats, from open grasslands and woodland to rare sand forest and wetland systems, creating a rich environment for a wide variety of wildlife and birdlife. This great variety of habitats offers outstanding photo opportunities, particularly for wildlife species less commonly seen elsewhere on the itinerary. Phinda is known for the Big Five, plus frequent sightings of cheetah sprinting over the open savanna—ideal conditions for capturing high-speed action and unobstructed scenes. The reserve also offers good chances to see rarer species such as pangolin, along with nyala and black rhino browsing dense tamboti thickets.

Our base, the award-winning Phinda Mountain Lodge, sits atop a hill with sweeping views across the surrounding bushveld. Daily game drives with our Expedition Leader plus expert local guides and trackers focus on maximizing photographic conditions, with time and flexibility to position for the best light and compositions.



### **Days 7 - 10: Sabi Sand—MalaMala Private Game Reserve**

Depart this morning on a scheduled flight to Kruger Mpumalanga International Airport, then transfer to MalaMala Game Reserve, one of the oldest, largest and most highly regarded private wildlife sanctuaries in South Africa. Covering 33,000 acres and sharing a 12-mile unfenced border with world-renowned Kruger National Park, MalaMala lies in the heart of the legendary Sabi Sand region, the country's premier safari destination. 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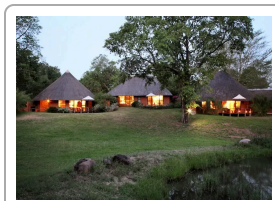
### Fairlawns Boutique Hotel

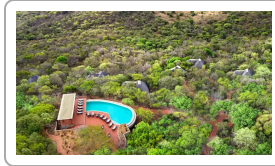


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### **Madikwe Safari Lodge**

Private reserves are essential to the best African safari, especially in South Africa. In the exclusive wilderness areas of Sabi Sand, Marataba, and either Madikwe in 2026 or Phinda in 2027, we explore exceptionally varied habitats in solitude, photographing abundant wildlife away from other visitors (most of whom are traveling on paved roads inside the public parks).

### An Unusually Diverse Itinerary for Varied Photography

Most South Africa safaris concentrate on Kruger National Park, and rightfully so, as its wildlife is legendary. Naturally, our itinerary includes the Greater Kruger ecosystem, but from a private reserve, where visitor numbers are strictly limited. MalaMala has an unfenced border with the park, so wildlife can wander back and forth freely. Our itinerary also includes two other less-visited private reserves, adding yet more elements of diversity with completely different ecosystems and landscapes.

### Remote & Intimate Luxury Accommodations

Most visitors to South Africa are relegated to larger, impersonal safari lodges that dominate in the national parks. Since our focus is private reserves, our guests enjoy exclusive boutique lodgings. Our isolated luxury camps and lodges are highlights in their own right. Each blends seamlessly with the natural environment, and tents and chalets have private verandas to maximize personal wildlife photo encounters right where you're staying.

### Flights Maximize Your Time on Safari

While we enjoy watching the countryside unfold on driving transfers between airstrips and reserves, we put a big focus on flights between our destinations, arranging air transfers where possible to maximize your time photographing wildlife, rather than negotiating rough roads on too many long drives. And from the air, you'll gain a whole different perspective on South Africa's dramatic landscapes and roaming wildlife.

### **The Very Best Vehicles—with a Guaranteed Window Seat**

Standard safaris in South Africa often utilize cramped mini buses. In contrast, we charter top-quality custom safari vehicles that optimize comfort and photography access. Our 4x4 Land Rovers and Land Cruisers have a suspension system designed for rugged terrain, and an open-top, open-sided, tiered seating arrangement maximizes photo opportunities. Each vehicle has 10 cushioned passenger seats, but since we don't fill them to capacity, everyone has an unimpeded side view. Each row is raised slightly higher than the one in front of it, allowing for unobstructed views of scenery and wildlife.

### **Exclusive Opportunities for Bush Walks and Night Drives**

Guided bush walks and night drives are available on the private reserves we visit, though not in national parks, where most safaris go. You'll appreciate the rare opportunity to stretch your legs while on safari as we get close-up shots of interesting smaller species, which most safari-goers confined to vehicles miss. And drives after dark reveal fascinating nocturnal wildlife that's rarely seen by the typical traveler.

### Important Information About This Trip

Our Secluded South Africa Photo Expedition combines three spectacular wildlife camps. The itinerary involves quite a bit of travel—both by safari vehicle and by private aircraft—but in the company of our professional safari Expedition Leader, we've determined that our routing is the best way to explore this remote, diverse and far-reaching region that is replete with wildlife. Changes to the itinerary may occur in order to take advantage of conditions unique to the season and/or to accommodate unexpected changes in flight schedules; therefore, itineraries may need to be rerouted or redesigned without notice.



### Mandatory Insurance

Since the areas we travel to are remote and wild (that's why we go there!), we require that all guests have, at minimum, medical evacuation insurance for this program. This is for the safety of all guests. We require that your chosen independent insurance plan includes at least \$250,000 in medical evacuation coverage.

To protect your investment and to provide peace of mind while you travel, we also strongly recommend purchasing comprehensive travel insurance. Plans may cover everything from medical treatment to trip cancellations and delays and lost luggage. ### Getting There & Getting Home

This trip begins and ends in Johannesburg, South Africa. Because this is a long international journey, **we recommend that you arrive at least one night prior to Day 1** to rest from your travels and begin the trip refreshed. For guests who come in early, recommended hotels will be included in your pre-departure materials. You must arrive in Johannesburg by 5 pm on Day 1 in order to attend the 6:30 pm welcome dinner.

**You may depart Johannesburg anytime after 6 pm on the final day.**

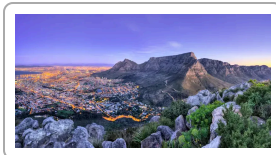

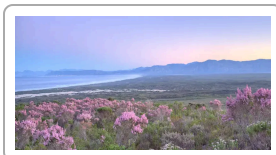

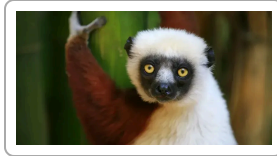
