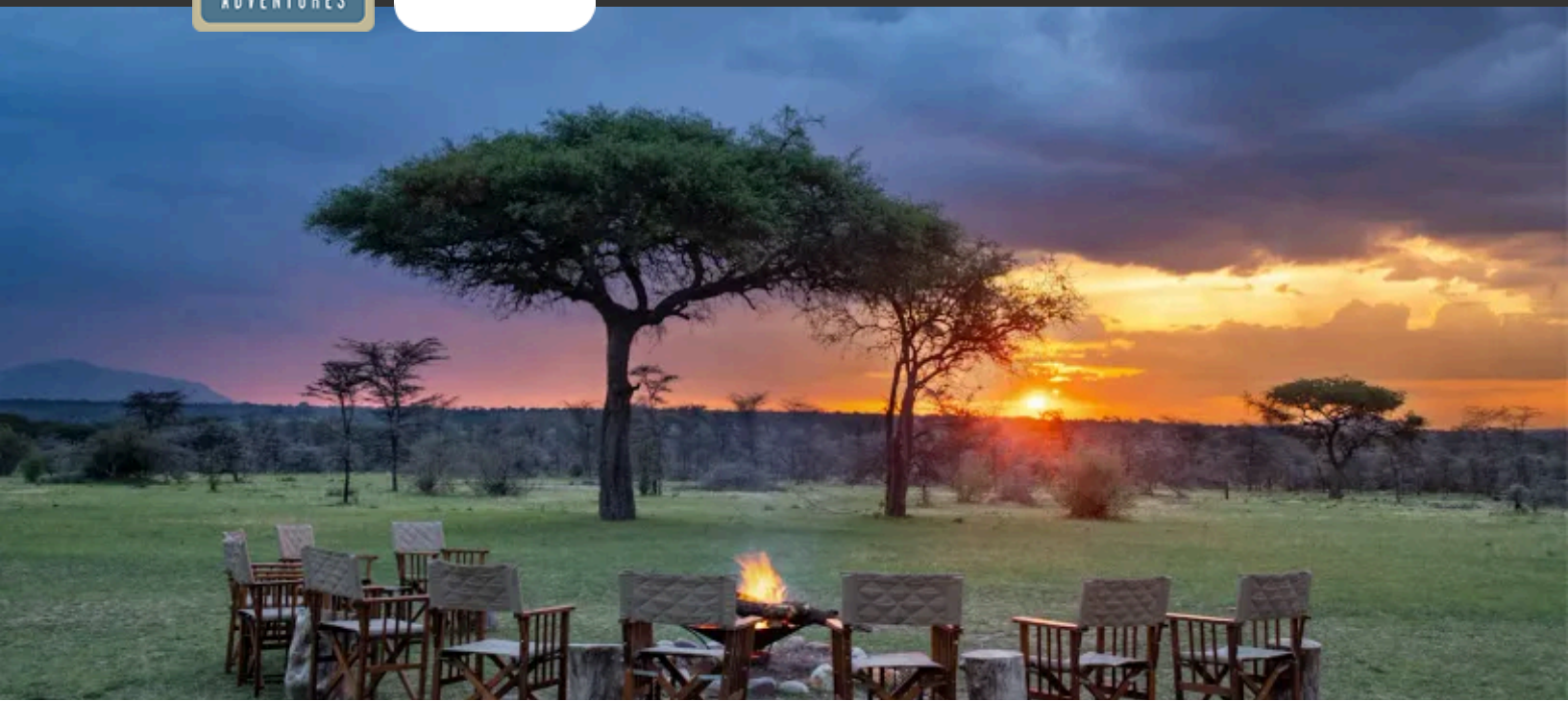

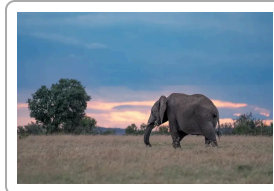

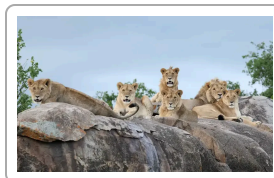

June–October Itinerary

June–October safaris visit the northern Serengeti when the herds are heading into the Maasai Mara and back and dramatic river crossings may occur. This itinerary also includes our new Elephant Conservation Camp and Reteti Elephant Sanctuary in northern Kenya.



December–March Itinerary

December–March safaris visit the southern Serengeti when the herds are in a relatively stable position, to give birth and nurture their young. This safari also includes our new Elephant Conservation Camp and Reteti Elephant Sanctuary in northern Kenya.

House of Waine

Set amid manicured gardens in the quiet residential suburb of Karen on the outskirts of Nairobi, the House of Waine, once a private estate, offers an appealing alternative to standardized city hotels.

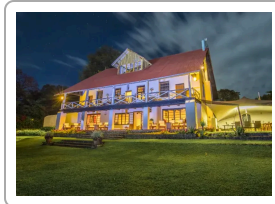
Nat Hab's Serengeti East Camp

Located in a remote sector of the eastern Serengeti where solitude (and big cats!) reign, our mobile safari camp takes bush comfort to a new level, with seven canvas safari tents surrounded by rich wildlife habitat.



Nat Hab's Migration Camp—Serengeti North

Our own deluxe mobile tented camp is set seasonally for proximity to the flow of wildebeest and zebra herds through the Serengeti, optimizing the chance to witness the migration at close range.



Ngare Sero Mountain Lodge

Ten spacious period-style suites front a sprawling lawn and lush gardens surrounding a 1905 German farmhouse, transformed from a colonial home into a tranquil lodge at the foot of Mount Meru.



Our Pride of East Africa Safari Stands Above the Rest!

If you're making a once-in-a-lifetime trip to East Africa, keep these key elements in mind as you compare options. You won't find a superior safari that combines the best of Kenya and Tanzania.

1

A Rare Secluded Experience, Away from Crowds

There's no question East Africa draws a lot of safari travelers. The abundant wildlife in the famous national parks of Kenya and Tanzania makes them duly popular destinations. That's why we concentrate on private reserves where wildlife abounds but visitor numbers are strictly limited. We know you don't want to come all the way to East Africa to see a lion surrounded by 15 or 20 other safari vehicles. On exclusive private conservancies, we are mostly alone with the animals.

2

An Itinerary Designed Around the Migration

Many companies operate the same standard "migration safari" circuit year-round, with no concern for time-specific locations for the arrival of the herds. We focus on the best time to see the animals, then build our itineraries and dates around that, attempting to time our presence for peak viewing. An integral feature is our mobile base camps, strategically positioned for proximity to where wildlife is most prolific at that time.

3

Exclusive Safari Activities on Private Reserves

Most safaris stay within the main areas of the most popular national parks and reserves. In contrast, we choose remote small camps on private conservancies within the Maasai Mara and Serengeti ecosystems, away from big lodges and primary roads filled with vehicles. From these adjacent reserves, we have easy access to more remote sectors of the parks while also enjoying special privileges not allowed within their bounds, such as guided safari walks, off-road driving, and night drives in search of nocturnal wildlife.

Meet the World's Last Two White Rhinos & Witness Conservation in Action

Located on the Laikipia Plateau in the shadow of Mount Kenya, Ol Pejeta is a working cattle ranch, which first set aside land for rhino conservation in 1988. Today this 90,000-acre preserve is the largest black rhino sanctuary in East Africa and home to . Visit this pair of females with their guards, and learn about groundbreaking science that's being done to save their species.

A Rare Visit to Northern Kenya's Namunyak Conservancy & Elephant Sanctuary

Namunyak, one of Kenya's most pristine wilderness areas, is a critical refuge for important northern populations of reticulated giraffe, gerenuk, leopard, African wild dog, impala, lion, greater kudu and many different birds. The conservancy is particularly important for elephants as they move seasonally between the Mathews Range and the Ngare Ndare Forest near Mount Kenya. Explore from Nat Hab's new Elephant Conservation Camp—including a private visit to Reteti Elephant Sanctuary.

Small Groups Mean Better Wildlife Encounters

We travel with a maximum of 12 guests. Many East African safaris take groups of 20 or more, packed into cramped mini-buses. Small groups mean we get closer to the herds, have better photo opportunities, and our experience is enriched by personalized interpretation from our Expedition Leaders as we watch the wildlife action side by side.

Maximize Comfort & Time with Internal Flights

Many safari companies transport you to and from the bush by vehicle—meaning long, dusty drives over rough roads. We've included flights wherever possible, maximizing time for what you have come to East Africa for: wildlife viewing on safari.

We limit the number in each safari vehicle to maximize comfort, and every traveler has a window seat for unimpeded views and photography—this is not the case with every safari operator.

This comprehensive itinerary is designed to show travelers the very best wildlife destinations these two countries have to offer. To maximize our time on safari, the adventure will begin in Nairobi, Kenya and finish in Arusha, Tanzania with an internal flight and border crossing during the mid-point of our trip connecting these two wildlife gems.

Mandatory Insurance

Since the areas we travel to on this trip are remote and wild (that's why we go there!), we require medical evacuation insurance for our guests' safety. If you decline the medical evacuation insurance coverage offered by Natural Habitat, we request that you send us documentation of the independent coverage you have selected. We will add the cost of a medical evacuation policy to your tour invoice until you provide our office with proof of coverage including your insurance company's name, contact number and your individual policy number. Thank you for understanding that our policy exists exclusively in the interest of our guests' safety.



Getting There & Getting Home

This trip begins in Nairobi, Kenya, and ends in Arusha, Tanzania. Because this is a long international journey, **we recommend that you arrive at least one night prior to Day 1** to rest from your travels and begin the trip refreshed. For guests who come in early, recommended hotels will be included in your pre-departure materials. You must arrive in Nairobi by 5 pm on Day 1 in order to attend the 7 pm welcome dinner.

You may depart Arusha anytime after 5 pm on the final day.

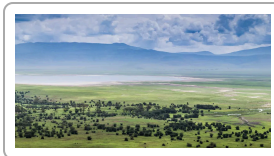

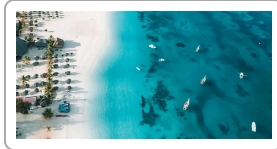

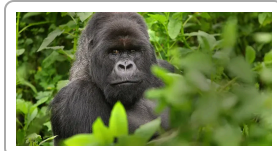
